



Proposal to merge Oakwood Surgery, Rutland Lodge Medical Practice and Shadwell Medical Centre

Share your views on the proposed changes

What this survey is about?

We need to do things differently across our GP practices to ensure that our services are sustainable in the future. Representatives from Oakwood Surgery, Rutland Lodge Medical Practice (including the branch, Carlton Gardens Surgery), and Shadwell Medical Centre are currently in discussions about combining the three practices (a merger).

We think that by working more closely together we will be able to: attract and retain high quality medical staff; better meet increasing demand on services and provide a wider range of services to patients.

Oakwood Surgery, Rutland Lodge Medical Practice, and Shadwell Medical Centre have together submitted a proposal to the NHS Integrated Care Board in Leeds (ICB in Leeds), to work with the registered patient populations of their practices about combining the practices.

The NHS ICB in Leeds (previously called the NHS Leeds Clinical Commissioning Group) is responsible for planning and funding most of your local healthcare services. It has the responsibility to make sure that any significant changes in primary care involve the people who might be affected by a proposed change. It has agreed for this work with patients to take place. They are providing support to the practices to ensure that as many people as possible can have their say.

The purpose of this survey is to inform patients, staff, and local people about these plans and to hear feedback about this proposal.

We are keen to hear your feedback and comments about this proposal.

The survey will be open until midnight on 16 July 2023.

We will share the involvement report with NHS ICB in Leeds. They will use your feedback to make a decision about whether the merger can go ahead. The ICB will also use feedback to make other decisions about future planning in Leeds' GP practices.





Background

Across the three practices, there have been several resignations from GPs, with a few known retirements coming soon. It has been difficult to recruit new GPs to the practices as they currently stand, despite a number of efforts.

Rather than running the risk of struggling to recruit enough GPs, or other staff, coming together under one contract will allow the practices to share various resources (including staff) to ensure consistent care for patients. This also provides opportunities for our staff, which will provide them more flexibility and opportunities to develop.

If the proposal is approved, this would create a larger patient population for the area under one contract, approximately 19,000 patients. This provides future opportunities to invest in developments in what can be offered to patients, such as access to new services, or opportunities work more efficiently.

It will also enable all three practices to continue to provide a good service to the local community supported by one another. It will also help the practices develop as a GP training practices.

What will this mean for me?

With this proposal, you should not see any significant changes to how you access health and care services from your GP practice. The aim of this merger is to support the practices in their resources and how they work together.

However, some of the expected benefits from the merger include:

- Better continuity of care sharing resources and staff, it is expected that the
 practices can reduce the use of locum staff. So, you are more likely to see the
 same staff.
- Improved choice there is expected to be the opportunity for you to choose where you receive healthcare appointments. For example, if you are happy to travel, and should an appointment be available, you could choose to attend an earlier appointment at a different GP practice
- **Better access** you will have access to a wider range of services and appointments.
- **Improved appointment system** as part of the proposal, the practices will create a new way for you to book appointments, using one telephone number for all practices, as well as online booking platforms. You'll still be able to book in-person and with the practice if you want.

Your pharmacy arrangements will remain the same. There will be no changes to how your medical records are stored.





Practice locations


Shadwell Medical Centre is on Shadwell Lane (LS17 8AE), not far from Harrogate Road.

Carlton Gardens Surgery is on Carlton Gardens in Woodhouse (LS7 1JL), not far from the city centre.
